

Helping Students Understand Current World Events

Many children are seeing images on the news and overhearing broadcasts and conversation that may leave them with questions, and it is our job to answer those questions.

Ask if they have questions.

Start by asking your child if they have questions about anything going on in the world right now, perhaps just after you think they may have seen or heard something that could be confusing or concerning to them. Take plenty of time to listen to what picture they may have drawn in their mind of the current events. Knowing their perception will greatly help you in the next steps of addressing them.

Tailor the conversation.

Be mindful of their age. You may have to explain to younger children what the word "conflict" or "war" means. Over-explanation may cause anxiety, so often it is enough to say that sometimes countries fight over things such as land, money, or power. Some children may continue to pry, leading you to give more explanation, but continue to use broad terms. Older children and adolescents may benefit from a short video* and conversation with you if they have questions.

*I found one on the Russia-Ukraine conflict that you can access <u>here</u>. It provides the basics and is a good springboard for conversation.

Validate their feelings.

Being able to discuss these world events without judgment and criticism allows them to gain confidence in speaking freely with you and will increase the likelihood of them sharing other important information with you down the road.

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Give reassurance.

Give reassurance that adults all over the world are working hard to come up with a resolution. Try to be calm and have a positive tone while explaining, because little ones' mirror neurons are strong and engaged within their young, impressionable minds. Mirror neurons are thought to be the road to promote imitation and observational learning (Cross et al., 2009).

Give them a practical way to help.

Support them if they show an interest in helping. It can be as small or as big as they would like. You know your child best. Younger children can draw a picture calling for peace, or a resolution of their choice. You can display it on the fridge or in a window in your home. Older children can create a fundraiser for the cause or write a letter to a local decision-maker.
