

Coach Birch has an infectious energy that is evident the first time anyone meets him. He is a man of strong faith and high moral character who has a passion for molding young people. Coach Jamaal Birch

Jamaal Birch was born in Rodalben, Germany and later moved to Aviano, Italy before making Charleston, South Carolina his home, where he spent the majority of his childhood. He later moved to San Antonio, Texas where his father was stationed while serving in the military. Coach Birch attended William Howard Taft High School where he ran track and played football. He went on to play football for the MacMurray College Highlanders in Jacksonville, Illinois where he received a Bachelor's of Science in Sport Management and a minor in business. He began his coaching career as the varsity wide receivers coach, pass game coordinator, and junior varsity head coach at Oceanside Collegiate Academy under Coach Chad Grier for three years. He also served as a Student Concerns Specialist at OCA. Coach Birch then moved to Charlotte to work at Providence Day School where he served as the varsity wide receivers coach, the junior varsity head coach, and the offensive coordinator. He also served as a learning coordinator and academic advisor at PD. While coaching at Providence Day, the varsity football team won back-to-back NCISAA Division 1 State Championships in 2021 and 2022. Coach Birch has developed college wide receivers who are now playing collegiately at UNC, Livingstone College, Western Carolina, and East Carolina. Six of his wide-receivers at PD currently have multiple division one offers. Coach Birch is also pursuing his masters in organizational leadership.

I wanted to take just a minute to introduce myself and go over my role as the new high school counselor. As a lot of you know, my role at the beginning of the school year was the administrative assistant to Dr. Kupersmith after 9 years of being home with my girls (Evie, 9 and Anya, 7 who attend the Lower School at FBS). My career includes 7 years working as a school counselor at a regional high school (1200 students) doing many things with grades 9-12. As I step into this new role here at FB High School, I want you all to know what my role looks like going forward.

HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELING

In a nutshell, the goal of the High School Counselor is to assist our students in making academic, personal, and career decisions that will allow them to reach their full potential. Every student is unique and as a counselor, it is my job to:

- Help our students recognize their individual strengths and talents.
- Work with students, teachers and families to plan an appropriate program of study that will allow the student to challenge his or herself to the best of their ability and explore their individual interests.
- Assist our students in finding post-secondary opportunities that will help them reach their goals and become productive members of our society.

I will also assist our students with the daily challenges they face as adolescents. Students are encouraged to make an appointment to discuss any concerns they may have, whether they are of an academic or personal nature. Anything more in depth (mental health concerns) will be encouraged to make an appointment with our school adjustment counselor, Rose Cummings.

The School Counseling Team is a resource for parents as well. Our goal as counselors is to work with you as you navigate your child's educational journey throughout the high school years.

Parent(s)/Caregiver(s) of juniors (and students!) are asked to SAVE THE DATE for our Planning for Life After FBS seminar that will be held on Thursday, February 9th at 6:30pm in the AUX Gym at the JI campus. I will be presenting on topics including communication tools and post-secondary options. The bulk of the presentation will cover college specific planning.

We're getting close to course selection/scheduling for the 2023-2024 school year! Please expect an email from me with more information coming soon on course registration for your student.

January's topic was "Protect your Privacy Like You're Famous" where they learned lots of ways to protect their devices and were surprised at some of these measures that work well and ones that surprisingly don't! "Find Your Influencers" when we will discuss the impact and importance of surrounding yourself with people that inspire you.
