LISTEN, LEARN, AND LOVE

The 2023 Commencement Speech as given by The Honorable John W. Kittredge Associate Justice, South Carolina Supreme Court



ABOUT THE SPEAKER

The Honorable John W. Kittredge Associate Justice, South Carolina Supreme Court, was born in Greenville, South Carolina in 1956 and is the son of Elwyn Herbert, Jr. (deceased) and Marian Jeffries Kittredge. John married Lila Graham Hewell on June 20, 1981. John and Lila have three children, Lila Marian, Will and Zay. The Kittredges are members of First Presbyterian Church in Greenville.

The Honorable John W. Kittredge Associate Justice, South Carolina Supreme Court graduated from the University of South Carolina, summa cum laude, in 1979. He graduated from the University of South Carolina School of Law in 1982. Academic honors include Phi Beta Kappa, Order of the Coif, and Wig and Robe.

The Honorable John W. Kittredge Associate Justice, South Carolina Supreme Court began his legal career as a law clerk to The Honorable William W. Wilkins, Jr. He practiced law in the firm of Wilkins, Nelson and Kittredge. Justice Kittredge was actively involved in community and state service: Governor's Committee on Crime and Delinquency; Governor's Juvenile Justice Task Force; Greenville Technical College Foundation (Vice-President); City of Greenville Civil Service Commission (Chairman); Greenville County Crime Stoppers (President); Board of Directors of Child Evangelism Fellowship. In addition to his admission to the South Carolina Bar, Justice Kittredge is also admitted to practice before the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, United States Court of Military Appeals, United States District Court for the District of South Carolina, United States Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals, and the United States Supreme Court.

The Honorable John W. Kittredge Associate Justice, South Carolina Supreme Court was elected to the South Carolina family court bench in 1991. He was elected to the circuit court bench in 1996, and the Court of Appeals in 2003. Justice Kittredge was elected to the Supreme Court in 2008.

2023 COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

I am honored to be with you this evening. Dr. Kupersmith and I began a discussion more than a year ago. I have been looking forward to being with you. I have thought a great deal about you, the graduates... Dr. Kupersmith has told me a lot about this class, all that you have achieved and especially the promise you represent for the enduring legacy of this wonderful school. There is so much I wanted to share. But as I thought about different topics, the topics seemed to lend themselves to a lecture. The last thing you need or want is for some old judge to give you a lecture. So, no lecture tonight.


What I want to share with you with are three simple words—listen, learn, and love. It is my sense that the three words-listen, learn and, lovealready form a part of you who are, from the solid foundation you have received here at First Baptist School of Charleston. I am impressed by Dr. Mitchell's words from the school website. Dr. Mitchell writes about the school this way: "Academic excellence with a Christian perspective. We aim to provide a rich and rigorous educational experience for each student while presenting the content through a Christian lens." Those are powerful words. Equally impressive is the following comment from Dr. Kupersmith: "The culture of the school integrates academic substance, social propriety, and spiritual nourishment." How blessed you are to be part of this school, and may I add, this family. I can assure you that to the school's wonderful leaders, the teachers, the coaches... you are family.

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I serve as a judge. I share a story from a case years ago in court. It was a case where the accused pled guilty to a crime—the crime was possession of cocaine. When someone pleads guilty, you need to make sure the person pleads guilty freely and voluntarily, fully aware of the consequence of admitting guilt. I asked a standard question—sir, are you in fact guilty of possessing cocaine? The answer was, "no sir, I did not possess cocaine; it possessed me." While I did not impose a maximum sentence, I did sentence the young man to jail and I encouraged him to turn his life around. That story, as you will see, has a lot to do with the message of listen, learn and love.

I begin with listen. Be a good listener. So, few people today are interested in listening. In the Bible, James, chapter 1, verse 19, it says, "be swift to listen, slow to speak and slow to anger." That's good advice. Most folks look for the first opening in any conversation to talk about themselves. A conversation is not a monologue one person inflicts on another. You be different—be a good listener. When you find someone who is genuinely interested in you, with the gift of listening, you have found a real treasure. You be that person with the gift of listening.

What about learning. Do you already know a lot? What is the difference between knowledge and wisdom? There's a saying that school is a great repository of knowledge-you enter knowing everything; you leave knowing nothing. That is learning reaching to wisdom. Learning is a lifelong process. Dr. Mitchell, Dr. Kupersmith, your teachers and coaches—they are all still learning. I am still learning. Let me challenge you to approach learning as you approach growing in your faith. I borrow the phrase "Christian lens" from Dr. Mitchell. Learn through a Christian worldview, a Christian lens. Understand what your worldview is. Each of us has a worldview, usually acquired by default by simply yielding to cultural influences. If you live your life through the lens of the world, you will be controlled and possessed by the things around you. And those things, whether material things or status or a title or whatever it may be, can be alluring. If you let your guard down, those things will possess and control you instead of you possessing them. I suggest you be more conscious, more intentional about your worldview. Although it may not be the politically correct alternative in this increasingly secular society, I suggest to you a worldview based on faith in God and His truths will be the most liberating and will sustain you when times of difficulty come. And you will face difficulties and challenges—they are an inevitable part of life. In





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Romans, chapter 5, we learn that "suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope." The worldview of the Christian lens produces true character. Character and integrity will define you. In every decision-especially including the smallest decisions -do what is right. If you show honesty ... integrity ... in the small decisions, you will have integrity in the big decisions. Every day we make many decisions. Every day we have opportunities to learn. As you graduate tonight, realize learning never ends. Never stop learning; never stop growing in faith. One more comment about learning. We live life forward, yet we understand life backward. It is not until we are down the road a way that we can appreciate the terrain that God has placed before us. There will be fun and joy, yet we all face strugales, and we must navigate the challenges that life places in our paths. This is not easy—life's struggles are neither welcome nor fun. But they are part of life, and if viewed through a Christian lens, you will persevere and produce character. And on the backside, as you look through the rearview mirror, you will better understand and grow from the learning experience. In faith, you will take that knowledge, and apply it wisely in your future decisions.

And now I come to love. Listen, learn and love. Your success, satisfaction and joy in life will come from relationships. John Donne's "No Man Is An Island" teaches that no one is self-sufficient. Relationships are so important. If your source of information and affirmation comes from the media or social media, you may well be led to believe that relationships are to be treated as disposable. That is wrong and that is not love. Think of parents who have guided you-and loved you every step of the way—so that you could reach this milestone. Think of your teachers and coaches and others who have supported and encouraged you. That support and encouragement is love. I tell you, very confidently so, that when you turn 30, 50, 70 and beyond, some of your best friends in life are sitting with you this evening—lifelong friendships that were forged right here. Most of my dearest friends in life I made during my high school years. True relationships are not disposable; they are enduring. That is love. Remember the familiar words: Love is patient, love is kind. Love does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. Love is not self-seeking; love builds up; it encourages. Love is not acquiring or possessing things.

Remember the fellow who pled guilty to possessing cocaine. I sentenced him to prison for just enough time that I hoped would get his attention. Years later, I was approached on the street. Judge, do you remember me? I didn't. He reminded me. It was him. My first thought was this is not going to end well. But he thanked me. We talked a long time. He had read the Bible in prison and came to faith in Christ. He was engaged to be married.

He had a job and was doing very well. He said, "by the way, I have learned a lot. I used to never have love in my heart when the world was possessing me. But I listened to God's word; I have learned how to make better decisions and I have learned to love."

So, we come to the end. Listen, learn and love. Please understand that to listen, learn and love properly, it takes discipline ... intentionality. Living life on autopilot or cruise control does not end well. But if you do any of the threelisten, learn, love-with purpose in the right way, you will be doing all three at once. Leave this evening proud of what you have accomplished; leave this evening with hearts of gratitude for those who made this moment possible for you; leave this evening with respect and appreciation for the people ... the family ... of the First Baptist School of Charleston; you are leaving this wonderful school ... don't ever let this wonderful school leave you; as you leave this evening, remain anchored to the Christian lens and go forth to listen, learn and love. Today is a great day to be a Hurricane. God bless each of you, the distinguished graduating class of 2023.

Dear Seniors,

Judge Kittredge summoned you at commencement to "listen, learn, and love." He's a smart guy who has seen many casualties over many years on the bench. He has also seen dramatic examples of resilience, as he noted in his remarks. Resilience is a necessary ingredient of good health. Cultivating this quality will pay massive dividends over a lifetime. Everyone will face disappointments and unforeseen hurdles. Surmounting obstacles and setbacks require a mindset that allows for failure. A wise friend of mine proposes that we regret most the things we did not do, rather than the things we did. First Baptist has been a community that stretched you and inspired you to go beyond your comfort zone. Please don't forget that the teachers and staff that prodded and praised you remains in your corner. Please stay in touch. Send an email when you have a story you want to share with people who are interested in you, as we are. We also remain mentors to you. If we seemed to be able advisors when you went to school here, we probably have not lost our touch. Come to ball games, visit classes, hang out at lunch. On returning, you will have privileges that accrue to graduates you can wear non-branded clothing and park in an open spot. TRANSITIONS

As our children and students transition from their current grade year to Summer, they are excitedly told about what to expect next year from their teachers. They anticipate summer work, dream of summer plans with friends and family and begin filling in their social calendar. While most of these thoughts are positive, there is often a light underlying anxiety of the unknown. There are several things we can do to help our children with some consistency and reliability at home. A few ideas to keep some continuity from one school year to the next is to keep a few of your daily routine items the same. Some to consider are:

Rise Time

Most look forward to sleeping in so that likely shouldn't be one, but an hour range to be up and moving would be beneficial.

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Wake-up Routine

It is helpful when school reconvenes if your child is used to a morning routine. It might include getting up, brushing their teeth and hair, washing their face, getting dressed and eating breakfast. The nice part is there's no rush!

Schoolwork/Reading/D.E.A.R. Time

Consider having a similar time each day for your child to do summer work and/or read throughout the summer weekdays. To keep the consistency, if there isn't summer work to be done, you can do D.E.A.R., "Drop Everything and Read" time.

Bedtime Routine

Similar to the morning routine, there would be a few items to consistently do each evening before bed.
