## Get to Know Dr. Leonard Kupersmith

Dr. Kupersmith joins us this year as our High School Principal

My name is Leonard Kupersmith, and I have a story. I started teaching in Missouri 53 years ago and never stopped until I retired as a headmaster in the Upstate a year ago

I hated retirement because I was missing my calling: working in schools. Through God's grace and human kindness, I was led to First Baptist to return to what drew me originally into schools: working directly with students and teachers who do noble work.

Everyone at First Baptist School also has a name and a story. I will do my best to know your name and hear your story.

So, please talk to me about yourselves as we get to know one another.

My sole message to everyone today is THANK YOU. Thank you for being here to allow us to have school again together, and thank you in advance for staying healthy and safe so that we can have a year unbroken by health threats. This aim has to be a team effort, or it won't succeed.

I believe that we do best when we know our purpose, our why, our motivation for what we do. I like to tell my students in advance of studying a piece of literature why we are reading it out of the myriad choices

School in my view has two general functions: building social attributes that will shape us as friends, neighbors, and workers and acquiring self- knowledge—discovering who we are and what animates us to achieve particular goals.

Outer directed and inner directed—social behavior and insight into self.

In regard to the second and more important pursuit, I want to leave you with a poem that I have shared with many students over the years. It's one of many great poems by a recently deceased American poet named Mary Oliver – "The Summer Day":

Who made the world?

Who made the swan, and the black bear?

Who made the grasshopper?

This grasshopper, I mean -

the one who has flung herself out of the grass, the one who is eating sugar out of my hand, who is moving her jaws back and forth instead of up and down -

who is gazing around with her enormous and complicated eyes.

Now she lifts her pale forearms and thoroughly washes her face

Now she snaps her wings open, and floats away.

I don't know exactly what a prayer is.

I do know how to pay attention, how to fall down into the grass, how to kneel down in the grass, how to be idle and blessed, how to stroll through the fields,

which is what I have been doing all day.

Tell me, what else should I have done?

Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon?

Tell me, what is it you plan to do

with your one wild and precious life?

#### Past sponsored activities have included:


- Teacher Appreciation Breakfasts and Luncheons

# Health & Wellness Tips for Heading Back to School

Navigating your child's feelings about back-to-school during the Covid season can be a daunting task. They may feel strongly about a number of issues and may or may not share these things with you, but they are likely having some natural or elevated stress concerning back-to-school this year. Always, but more this year than any, it is important to be aware of the example that we are setting as the adults in their lives during these formative years; as unconventional as the time period may be.

## Tips for Navigating Back-to-School

Address their concerns but keep responses appropriate in length. Don't spend too much time on the negatives and the worries. Some children may need 5-10 minutes, and some 20-30, but try not to spend an exorbitant amount of time on the negative aspects.

**Reassure them of the safety measures that we ARE doing.** There is lots of discussion on safety measures and while they are good and helpful, we are always assessing the situation and trying to make them better for our school community.

**Remind them that this is temporary.** While some things will stay, this period of unprecedented times will pass and we will have more stable measures to mitigate spread and continue to do all of the things that we once did.

Encourage them to do anything that they can to protect themselves and others. There are many measures that we can take to ensure a safe and healthy new year that are up to us as individuals. Give them some of that ownership and power to protect themselves. Some measures are reliant on others, but there are many that we can manage on our own.

### Most importantly, lead by example showing a positive attitude about the upcoming year.

Engage in open, honest conversation but help them reframe things if they are feeling down. They will mirror what they see in us. If you say "I hate these things too. They'll be gone soon" considering masks, dividers, or any other precaution, it presents a negative connotation. If you say "Some of these things are not my favorite, but I trust our school community to do what is right to protect all involved and we will always do what we can." That gives off a very different feeling.

We know that there may be obstacles, but we are very excited about this new school year, and with your help it will be a great one!
